SUMMARY

For the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission to continue to have the option to meet via teleconference during the pandemic, AB 361 requires the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission to make specific findings at least every thirty (30) days.

RECOMMENDATION

Make the following findings by a majority vote of the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission:

- a. A state of emergency has been proclaimed by California's Governor due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and continues to be in effect;
- b. The Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
- c. State and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19.

BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill 361 (AB 361) was signed into law by the Governor on September 16, 2021. A portion of AB 361 enacted amendments to California Government Code section 54953 regarding teleconference meetings. Those amendments authorize local agencies, like the City, to continue to conduct meetings by teleconference¹ during a Governor-proclaimed

¹ A "teleconference" occurs for purposes of AB 361 whenever one or more members of the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission connect to a Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission meeting via electronic means. Thus, even if four members of the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission meet in person, if the fifth joins the meeting via Zoom, the meeting will be a teleconference meeting that must be conducted in accordance with the requirements of AB 361.

state of emergency² provided that certain findings are made by the legislative body, and provided that certain procedural requirements are met regarding public access to the meetings.

A new requirement in AB 361 requires specific findings be reaffirmed at least every thirty (30) days in order for the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission to continue to have the option for one (1) or more of its members to use teleconferencing.

DISCUSSION

Required Findings

The teleconference provisions in AB 361 may only be utilized as long as a Governor-proclaimed state of emergency remains active, or while state or local officials have recommended measures to promote social distancing. When either of those is the case (both are true at this time), then in order to continue to teleconference using the new provisions of AB 361, the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission must make the following findings by majority vote every 30 days:

(A) The Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and

(B) Either of the following circumstances exist:

- (i) The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
- (ii) State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing³.

To comply with that requirement, the recommended action would have the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission find each of the following:

- a. A state of emergency has been proclaimed by California's Governor due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and continues to be in effect;
- b. The Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and
- c. State and local officials continue to recommend measures to promote social distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19.

The "Every 30 Days Thereafter" Requirement

As noted above, AB 361 findings must be made "no later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time pursuant to [AB 361], and every 30 days thereafter..."

² For purposes of AB 361 "...state of emergency' means a state of emergency proclaimed pursuant to Section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act..." Cal. Gov't Code Sec. 54953(e)(4). Section 8265 of CESA in turn refers to a state of emergency proclaimed by the Governor

³ Cal Gov't Code Sec. 54953(e)(3)

In order to preserve the option for the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission or individual members of the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission to participate in meetings during the pandemic via teleconference in the future, the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission will have to adopt the required findings at least every 30 days.

Potential Consequence of Not Making the Findings Every 30 Days

AB 361 does not expressly state what happens if a legislative body fails to make the required findings "every 30 days." However, it expressly requires the timely re-approval of the findings "in order to continue to teleconference" in the manner that AB 361 authorizes.

As a result, if the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission does not adopt the required findings every 30 days, then the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission could be precluded from continuing to teleconference thereafter, perhaps even if the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission was later willing to adopt the findings at a later date. For this reason, the City Attorney recommends that the [Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission adopt the required findings at this time and at least every 30 days thereafter, unless the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission decides as a permanent matter that it will no longer permit teleconferencing at all (e.g., regardless of whether the state of emergency worsens).

Procedural Requirements for The Conduct of Teleconference Meetings

AB 361 contains several new requirements for the conduct of teleconference meetings with which the City has prepared to comply. Specifically, each meeting must:

1. Allow members of the public to attend and comment at the meeting via call-in option or internet-based service option;
2. Protect the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties and the public appearing before the legislative body;
3. In the event of disruption which prevents broadcasting the meeting or which prevents members of the public from offering public comments via the call-in or internet-based option, the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission must take no further action until the disrupted public access is restored;
4. The City may not require public comments to be submitted in advance, and must offer the opportunity for the public to offer comments "in real time" during the meeting; and
5. The public must be allowed "a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow members of the public to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register [to log into the teleconference], or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment.

SUMMARY

BACKGROUND

Over the past year, Recreation and Community Services programs have steadily climbed towards their pre-COVID-19 enrollment. The Department is proud to have maintained, adapted, and grown classes, camps, and programs offered to the community. This report provides an update on the upcoming 2022 summer camps, classes, and programs.

DISCUSSION

Registration for Summer 2022 classes and programs opened online on Friday, April 22 for Los Alamitos residents and Sunday, April 24 for non-residents. Walk-in and faxed registrations were accepted starting on Monday, April 25, and all registration is available online at www.cityoflosalamitos.org/recreation.

Lil' Chef Cooking Camp (4-6 years old) & Master Chef Camp (7-12 years old) – Students will learn kitchen safety, hands-on skills, create delicious food, and learn techniques to be creative in a fun, safe environment.

Jurassic Dino Camp (4-6 years old) – Participants will learn all about dinosaurs in this fun, hands-on class! Explore the Triassic, Jurassic, and Cretaceous eras through all sorts of project-based activities including dino digs, fossil hunts, and 'dino of the day' activities! Participants even get to excavate their own dino egg, learning essential paleontology skills.

Youth Art Camp (6-12 years old) – Participants will explore their creativity through all different ways of art. We will be looking at variations of art styles and creating masterpieces using different elements such as watercolor, chalk, glue, balloons, cardboard, and clay.

Fairytale Camp (5-12 years old) – Participants will enter the world of fairies, mermaids, unicorns, and princesses for a week of mythical fun in this charming camp! Activities will include arts, crafts, music, dress up, and dancing!

Both Monday/Wednesday/Friday and Tuesday/Thursday classes will convert to camps for the summer, with sessions running two weeks long. Each session will feature a theme, such as Melt Into Summer to kick off the season.

Day Camp/Counselors in Training (CIT)

Day Camp registration is currently available for ages 5 to 12. Staff has worked hard to secure weekly excursions for the participants, with some weeks offering two excursions. Staff expects to fill up to 100 participants this summer. Counselors in Training will also be available for ages 13 to 16. SUMMARY

The Public Works Division oversees the maintenance of facilities and park maintenance. This report provides the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Commission with a bi-annual update.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Parks, Recreation and Cultural Arts Commission receive and file the report; and
2. Commission discuss and provide recommendations.

Background

The Public Works Division oversees maintenance of City parks and facilities maintenance. This report includes information on repairs, future projects, and changes in regulations pertaining to Parks, sports fields, and playground equipment. Additionally, this report will further assist the Commission in providing staff with recommendations and or concerns.

Discussion

The following report provides updates and details on repairs made to the listed City parks and facilities:

- **Laurel Park**

Continued monthly maintenance. This past winter, Laurel Park was treated with pre-emergent to help prevent the growth of future weeds to help the turf grass stay healthy. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Regular irrigation repairs of broken sprinklers.
- Removed two diseased trees.
- Purchase and placement of one new 8 ft. bench table.
- Installation of new automatic door closers for restrooms.

- **Little Cottonwood Park**

Continued monthly maintenance including playground safety checks and repairs. Additionally, Cottonwood was closed for 8 weeks starting in the month of December for field rehabilitation. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Repaired three irrigation valves during rehab.
- Replaced two broken sprinklers.
- Replacement of playground bicycle pedals.
- Installed two message kiosks.
- Planted three trees - a Cottonwood tree, a California Sycamore, and an Autumn Maple tree.
- Installed bird deterrent spikes on both message kiosks.
- Installation of new automatic door closers for restrooms.

- **Orville R. Lewis Park**

Continued monthly maintenance including playground safety checks and repairs. An effort on leveling the sports field and grass areas due to excessive gopher activity was done as well as adding additional gopher applications. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Moved book library to a safer location.
- Installed a message kiosks.
- Repaired three broken sprinklers in various location in the park.
- Filled ruts due to gophers.
- Installed bird deterrent spikes on message kiosks.
- Painted entrance fence blue.

- **Roberts Park**

Continued monthly maintenance including playground safety checks and repairs. Beautification of the park continues as we addressed several issues throughout the park. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Planted two trees by gym.
- Installed an irrigation battery clock.
- Refreshed planter with fill in plants.

- **Stansbury Park**

Continued monthly maintenance including playground safety checks and repairs. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Installed a new park bench by entrance.
- Installed a new doggie bag station.
- Hand painted City park name.
- Installed new City logo on entrance sign.
- Irrigation valve leak repair.

- **Labourdette Park**

Continued monthly maintenance including playground safety checks and repairs. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Replaced broken sprinklers in various location around the park.
- Unclogging and maintaining of the drinking fountain.
- New planting of the front entrance by the local Boy Scouts.

- **Sterns Park**

Continued park maintenance including weekly woodchip raking and playground safety checks. Sprinkler repairs have been done in various areas.

- **Soroptimist Park**

Continued park maintenance including weekly woodchip raking and monthly playground safety checks. The following maintenance were addressed as follows:

- Planting of various fill in plants through the park.
- Installation of new park trash receptacle

- **Coyote Creek Park**

Continued park maintenance including weed abatement, trimming, and irrigation checks and repairs. The following additions and repairs have been addressed:

- Fabrication and installation of gate. Preventing unauthorized vehicles from entering the site.
- Repaired fallen flood control entrance gate.

- **Community Center/Youth Center**

Public Works is continuing its efforts in creating a more inviting appearance to the Community Center and Youth Center by revamping the front entrance of the Community Center with new planters. The following updates have been made:

- Upkeep of planters around Community Center.
- Replaced old vase planters with new white vases in front of the Community Center.

Fiscal Impact

Facility and park maintenance and Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) are part of the Development Services budget that is annually adopted by City Council during the Budget process.

SUMMARY

This report provides the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission with an overview of the development and implementation of social media content and additional marketing materials utilized year-round to promote seasonal programs and events.

RECOMMENDATION

Commission receives and file.

BACKGROUND

The social media team was developed in February of 2021 at the height of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) stay at home mandate. In response to COVID-19, the Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department created a free Virtual Community Center located online. The Virtual Community Center was updated weekly with new content and was broken into five sections: Informational, Enrichment, Exercise and Fitness, Themed Weeks, and Entertainment. The content was catered to all ages and to be enjoyed from the safety of the individual's home. The Department's social media presence received a huge response from these efforts, proving the content produced would remain relevant even after the pandemic. Since its creation, the Department's social media outreach has grown immensely with a notable increase in community engagement. In addition to social media content, a wide variety of marketing materials are produced on a seasonal basis to promote the Department's programs and events year-round. The most important being the quarterly Recreation Brochure, detailing all the programs and events offered within the season. Additional marketing materials are created and distributed with the purpose of promoting programs and events to the community.

DISCUSSION

Social Media Team

The Social Media Team is made up of five staff members: Recreation Supervisor Joanna Contreras, Recreation Coordinators Alejandro Gonzalez Lecumberri and Samantha Kenny; Clerical Assistant Lauren Pavelec and Recreation Specialist Alix Anderson. Each team member plays a key role in the development and execution of social media content. Samantha Kenny leads the social media team with the responsibility of responding to comments and direct messages, facilitating social media team meetings, creating content calendars, and assisting in content creation. Alix Anderson develops the Instagram reels and Tik Tok's created to highlight Recreation staff, programs, and events. In addition, Alix creates post description captions, ensuring the correct information, links, and hashtags are stated. Lauren Pavelec creates content for themed weeks, where staff develop a theme for social media and include fun, interactive activities that emphasize community engagement for all ages. Lauren also creates all the National Holiday and office closure content. Alejandro is responsible for gathering the content, creating photo collages when necessary, submitting the content for approval, and ensuring all content is posted on the scheduled date for all social media platforms. Lastly, Joanna oversees the entire social media team, approves content, and approves the content calendar.

Social Media Platforms and Content

The Recreation and Community Services Department is represented on Facebook @Losalamitosrecreation, Instagram @losalrecreation, YouTube @CityofLosAlamitos, TikTok @losalamitosrecreation, and Next-door @CityofLosAlamitos. Social media content is developed and referenced on a monthly calendar. The social media team meets monthly to discuss the content being published for the upcoming month. Social media content consists of program and event promotions, program and event updates, themed week activities encouraging community engagement, staff recognition through posts and videos, park amenity highlight videos, National Days, National Holidays, office closures, and story highlights in collaboration with Los Alamitos businesses, program sponsors, and local non-profit organizations.

Additional Marketing Materials

Recreation Leader Amber Gutierrez, is a student at California State University, Long Beach studying Recreation and Leisure Studies with an emphasis in Recreation Therapy. Amber is currently working on fulfilling her 200 hour fieldwork requirement with the Recreation Department. As part of her fieldwork, Amber has organized and created a calendar for press release distribution. She is currently working on updating drafts for all of the press releases throughout the year for each event/program lead to review. Furthermore, Amber created the tri-fold pamphlet for the THRIVE Teen Expo event that took place on April 30. The pamphlet was utilized as a guide for the sessions taking place, event map, and to highlight the organizations that collaborated and supported the event.

Recreation Coordinator Alejandro Gonzalez Lecumberri, provides graphic design support to all City Departments throughout the year. He produces a variety of marketing materials which are displayed throughout the Community Center, City-wide Departments, and all around the Los Alamitos community through street banners. One of the most important marketing tools in the Recreation Department is the seasonal Recreation Brochure. It is an essential way of communicating about the classes, activities, and events being offered to the public within the season. Furthermore, in order to convey the information accurately in the brochure, a collective team effort is required to plan the content, gather all the necessary data such as descriptions, dates, costs, times, etc., design ads and messages according to the season being published, and finally distribute to Los Alamitos residents, businesses, partnerships, schools, and more.

The Weekly E-newsletter is another important marketing tool the City utilizes to communicate to the public about events that will take place in Los Alamitos, important City-wide Department's messages and information, Recreation classes and activities, etc. With an audience of approximate 12,200 contacts for this campaign, the Recreation & Community Services Department takes the lead to keep everyone up to date via regularly scheduled emails.

Additional informative and visual marketing communication to the public is through the City's website: <https://cityoflosalamitos.org/>, as well as periodic door hanger distributions around the Los Alamitos community.

FISCAL IMPACT

Expenditures allocated for the quarterly Recreation Brochure, social media, and display banners are funded through the City's General Fund from the Recreation and Community Services Department.
