MINUTES OF TRAFFIC COMMISSION MEETING OF THE CITY OF LOS ALAMITOS

REGULAR MEETING – March 13, 2024

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Traffic Commission met in Regular Session at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 13, 2024, Chair Murphy presiding.

Commissioner Patz led the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. ORAL COMMUNICATION

Chair Murphy opened oral communications.

A. Approval of the Minutes

Approval of the Minutes for the Regular Meeting of February 14, 2024.

Carried 5/0 (Mejia and D. Hill absent): The Traffic Commission approved the Regular Meeting Minutes of February 14, 2024.

6. STAFF REPORTS

A. Red Curb Request: 3902 Katella Avenue - Alamitos West Skilled Nursing Facility

Development Services Director Noda summarized the staff report.

Chair Murphy asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda that the attachments to the staff report were incorrect and that the correct attachments would be sent to the Traffic Commission via e-mail.

Chair Murphy asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda that the designated red curb for the Katella Senior Living Center is being used by the Fire Department.

Commissioner Marchese inquired about the following:

- Is there a parking lot in the back of the facility?
- How many parking spots will be lost?
- Where do employees and visitors park?

Los Alamitos West Health and Rehabilitation representative Jon Peralez stated that there is parking in the back of the facility and it is available to employees and visitors to park, along with street parking.

Development Services Director confirmed that two parking spots will be lost once the red curb is extended.

Chair Patz asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda that (40) forty feet is significant for the ambulance or fire truck to park.

Mr. Peralez requested for the two red curbs to extend (20) twenty feet west toward the skilled nursing facility.

Commissioner R. Hill asked for and received clarification from Mr. Peralez that the rear parking and ramp are accessible to the Fire Department.

Mr. Peralez stated that the reception and main nursing station are in the front of the facility, and it would be preferable to have the Fire Department access the building through the front entrance.

Commissioner Marchese pointed out that during last month's Traffic Commission Meeting, there was a concern about parking for residents in the Apartment Row neighborhood and that losing parking would be a big deal.

Commissioner Rojas asked and received clarification from Commissioner Patz that if the Traffic Commission approves the request, the Development Services Department will proceed with extending the red curb.

Motion/Second: Patz/R. Hill

Carried 4/1 (Marchese opposed/Mejia and D. Hill absent): The Traffic Commission approved the request to extend the red curb (20) twenty feet west of the fire hydrant.

City Engineer Kelley briefly discussed the Bloomfield Street Improvement Project from Katella Avenue to Florista Street.

- Spring Carnival on March 30th
- Race on the Base on April 13th
- Good Morning, Los Alamitos on March 26th at 9:00 a.m.

- Neighborhood Parking and Street Sweeping Survey results broken down by neighborhood presented at the April Traffic Commission Meeting.

Chair Murphy inquired about the following:

- Daylighting Law
- Street sweeping tickets by area
- Vehicles are required to park in the garage

Commissioner Patz inquired about the requested feedback on items brought up in the previous meetings. Development Services Director Noda suggested the Traffic Commission motion to bring the items back to the meeting as a staff report.

Development Services Director Noda confirmed that the City does not have a code that requires a resident to park their car in the garage.

5/0 (Mejia and D. Hill absent) Traffic Commission requested the Neighborhood Parking and Street Sweeping Survey to be broken down by neighborhood and itemized as a staff report in the upcoming Traffic Commission Meeting.

8. TRAFFIC COMMISSION INITIATED BUSINESS

Commissioner Rojas inquired about the traffic signal timing traveling east from Rossmoor on Bradbury Road through the Los Alamitos Boulevard intersection across into Los Alamitos (Highlands). Development Services Director Noda will confer with City Engineer Kelley on the timing and jurisdictional limits.

Commissioner Marchese asked and received clarification from Development Service Director Noda that the speed sensors on Farquhar Avenue do not track the vehicles.

Commissioner R. Hill inquired about the potholes on Katella Avenue.

Development Services Director Noda stated that the Public Works procurement code is tied to the City Charter, and anything over \$10,000 must go out for a Request for Proposal (RFP). He stated that an RFP is currently being drafted and is expected to be completed and taken to the City Council Meeting in May 2024.

Commissioner Patz asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda that in order to make an amendment, it has to be from the vote of the people, taken to the Budget Standing Committee, and then to City Council.

Development Services Director Noda stated that the City will begin the process of a charter amendment and is expected to present for the vote of the people in November 2024.

Commissioner R. Hill asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda that the City will be requesting to amend the procurement code to state code which is up to \$100,000.

Commissioner R. Hill inquired about the sidewalk over the bridge from Los Alamitos High School to Ball Road. Development Services Director Noda informed Commissioner R. Hill that the City Council approved a contract for concrete remediation. The contractor has done an assessment and they have

determined there are (44) forty-four areas for concrete repair and (8) eight aprons in the residential areas.

Commissioner Rojas asked and received clarification from Development Services Director Noda that there is an exception for potholes when they are considered an emergency such as a safety concern or life preservation.

Chair Murphy inquired about the street flooding due to the recent rain on Los Alamitos Boulevard from Farquhar Avenue to Katella Avenue.

City Engineer Kelley asked and received clarification from Chair Murphy that the window of flooding was about a day.

Development Services Director Noda briefly explained the Water Quality Management Program (WQMP) and stated that any new development in the City must meet the WQMP requirements.

Development Services Director Noda stated that a Storm Drain Master Plan assessment was done in the City by Willdan Engineering and when the City goes in to repair the street, it will tackle the issue of inadequate drainage at the same time.

SUMMARY

The City of Los Alamitos is seeking the community's feedback on the current neighborhood permit parking and street sweeping schedule. The online survey was conducted from October 23, 2023, to January 19, 2024. Several public workshops were held to gain additional feedback.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Review and discuss; and,
2. Receive and file.

BACKGROUND

Los Alamitos is split into sixteen neighborhoods, each with its own unique charm and concerns. Several Los Alamitos neighborhoods have a permit parking program. These neighborhoods include:

- Old Town West
- Old Town East
- Carrier Row
- Greenbrook/Woodcrest

Residents may obtain a parking permit through the Los Alamitos Police Department. A completed application must be submitted in person, and the vehicle's registration and driver's license information must match the place of residence. There are no initial fees for issuing a permit and no limitations on the number of permits. Residents may also obtain two guest permits at no charge. There is a \$10 replacement fee if the guest permit is damaged or lost. Resident permits and guest permits are valid for up to one calendar year. Residents may also request up to fifteen one-day guest permits.

Street sweeping is vital as it keeps our community clean and safe by removing dirt, metals, petroleum products, garbage, and vegetation regularly collected on our streets and gutters. Removing these materials is essential because they could end up in our storm drains and eventually out into the ocean. Keeping the gutters and storm drains clear helps reduce pollution and the likelihood of flooding during heavy rain. The survey also asks for feedback on

the various street sweeping schedules. The street sweeping schedule is part of the Los Alamitos Municipal Code (LAMC), and if there are any revisions, the City Council must approve the recommended changes.

Approximately every five years, the City of Los Alamitos engages residents to obtain feedback on the current neighborhood parking permit and street sweeping schedule. The last time the program was evaluated was in 2019. Commissioner R. Hill requests that this presentation be presented again to the Traffic Commission as it contains additional information.

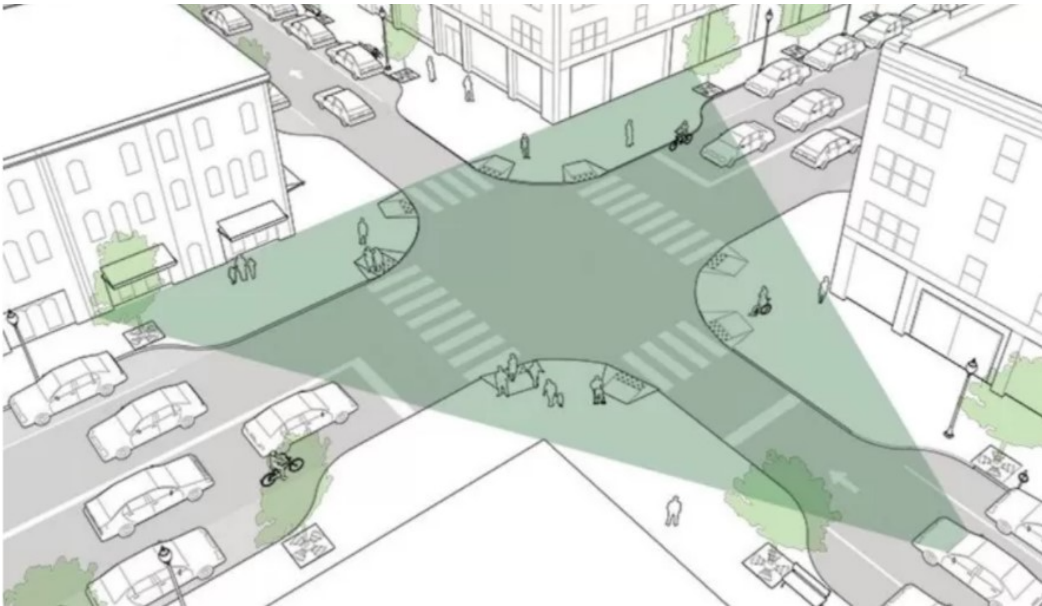

BACKGROUND

California's new Daylighting Law (AB 413) was signed into law in October 2023 to improve safety by limiting how close vehicles can park to crosswalks. The law creates a 20-foot buffer zone around crosswalks, making it illegal to park where it might block the views of pedestrians and drivers. On two-way streets, the law only affects the space on the right side approaching a crosswalk. If decided upon, local jurisdictions can paint zones that are longer or shorter than 20 feet.

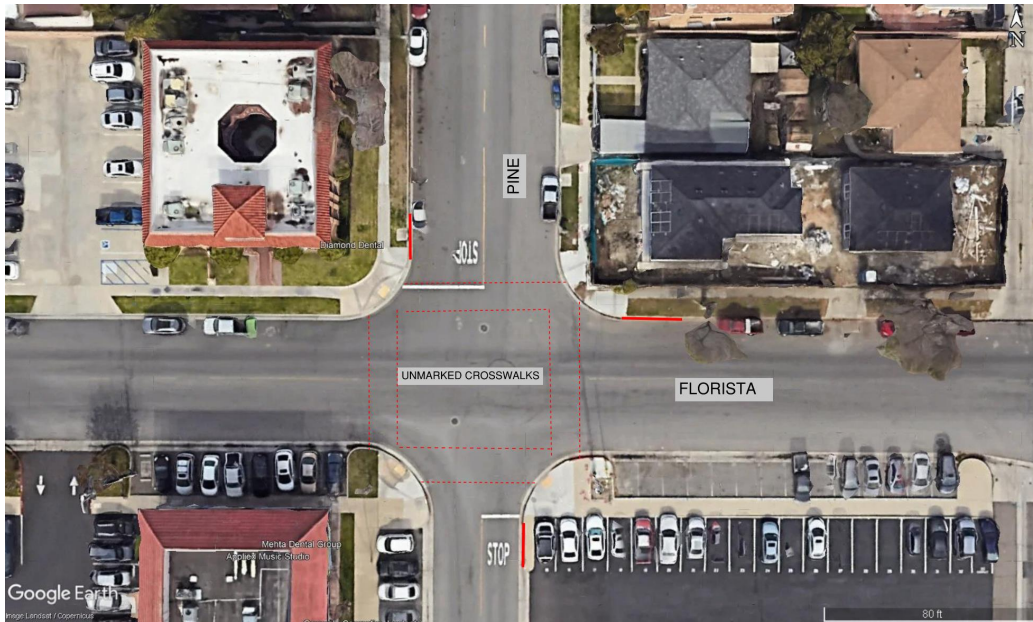


DISCUSSION

The Daylighting Law is clear for marked crosswalks but will create more complicated conditions for unmarked crosswalks.



California Vehicle Code (CVC) defines an unmarked crosswalk as a pedestrian crossing that lacks painted lines, signs, or signals and is usually found at intersections. Unmarked crosswalks are extensions of sidewalks, trails, or other pedestrian pathways and are common in California. They are typically between sidewalks at an intersection, and there is no unmarked crosswalk if there is a "no crossing" sign.



The law states that no citations will be issued until January 2025, only a warning. Local jurisdictions are evaluating their course of action.
