SUMMARY

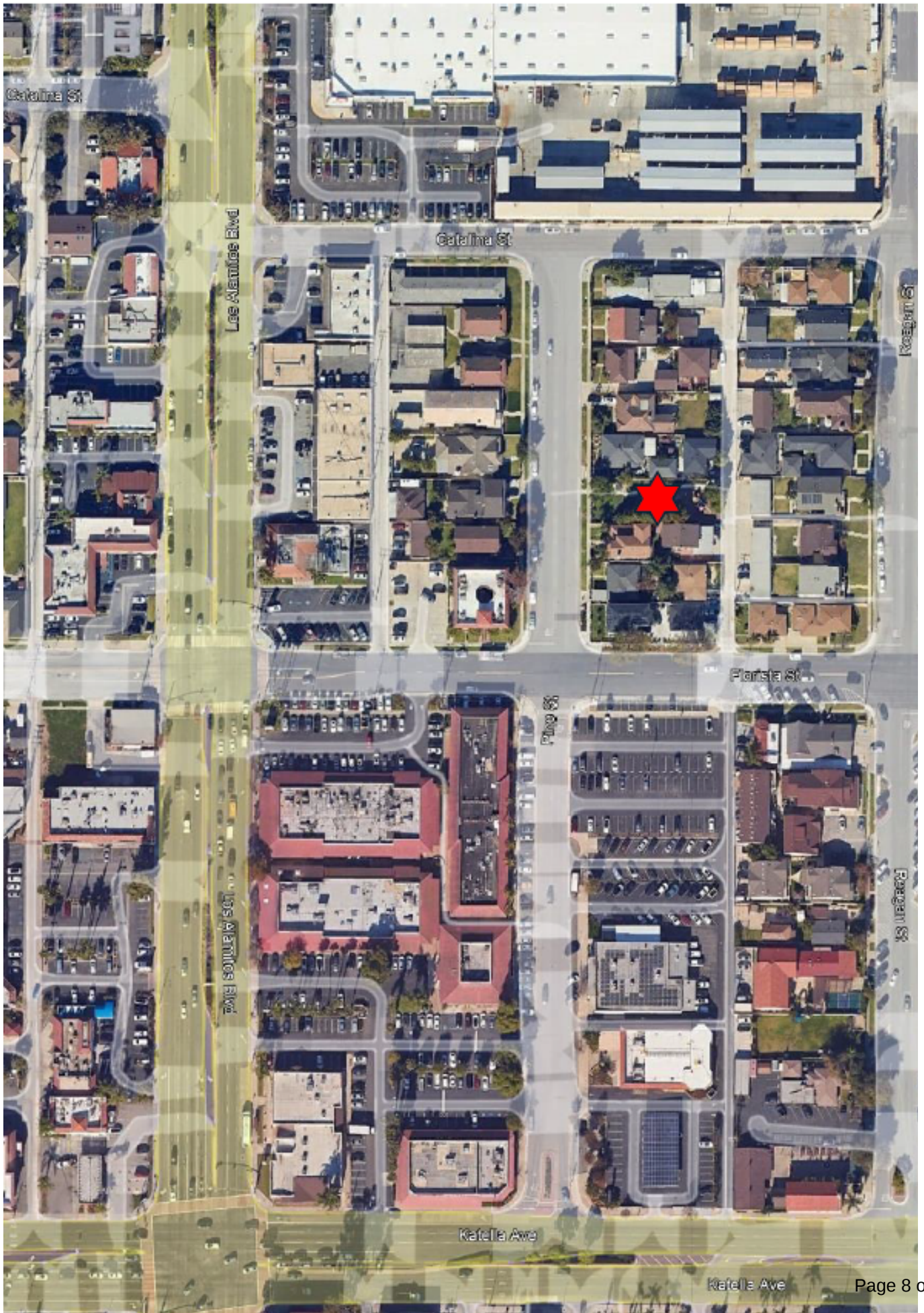
This item presents the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission with a proposed outlook of different options for site amenities, features, and design intended to renovate Soroptimist Park.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Receive file and discuss; and
2. Select the options presented for the site amenities.

BACKGROUND

Soroptimist Park, located at 10822 Pine Street in the Old Town West neighborhood, is a pocket park of approximately 0.17 acres. The park site last saw improvement to the play area in 1999, including the play structure apparatus and resurfacing, new benches and tables, concrete curbing, and park signage. Due to its unique size and location, the park is intended for passive use, with existing site amenities consisting of a school-aged appropriate playground, a small picnic-covered bench, and compact green space for leisure use.



DISCUSSION

The first park to receive renovation is Sterns Park (3871 Farquhar Avenue), which is currently under construction and expected to open in December 2024. Labourdette Park (4401 Howard Avenue) will commence construction in December and is scheduled to open in late spring 2025. As part of the overall general plan for renovating all parks in Los Alamitos, Soroptimist Park has been chosen as the next park to be re-imagined and renovated. The tentative timeline for the renovation will begin in late spring of 2025 and is expected to open in fall of 2025.

It is requested that the Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission discuss and recommend to the City Council the approval of the various options presented this evening. Attachment No. 1 will provide two alternative designs for park amenities, which include a playground structure, rubberized surfacing, and satellite play features. Each selection has a slight cost difference. The Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Commission recommendation and the attachments will be presented to the City Council at an upcoming meeting for final approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total for the Soroptimist Park Project will be approximately \$240,000. The renovation will be funded through Prop 68 for \$185,000, with the remaining balance of \$55,000 coming from the City's General Fund. The project will be spent in Fiscal Year 2024-2025 as part of the City Council approved Capital Improvement Project (CIP) list.

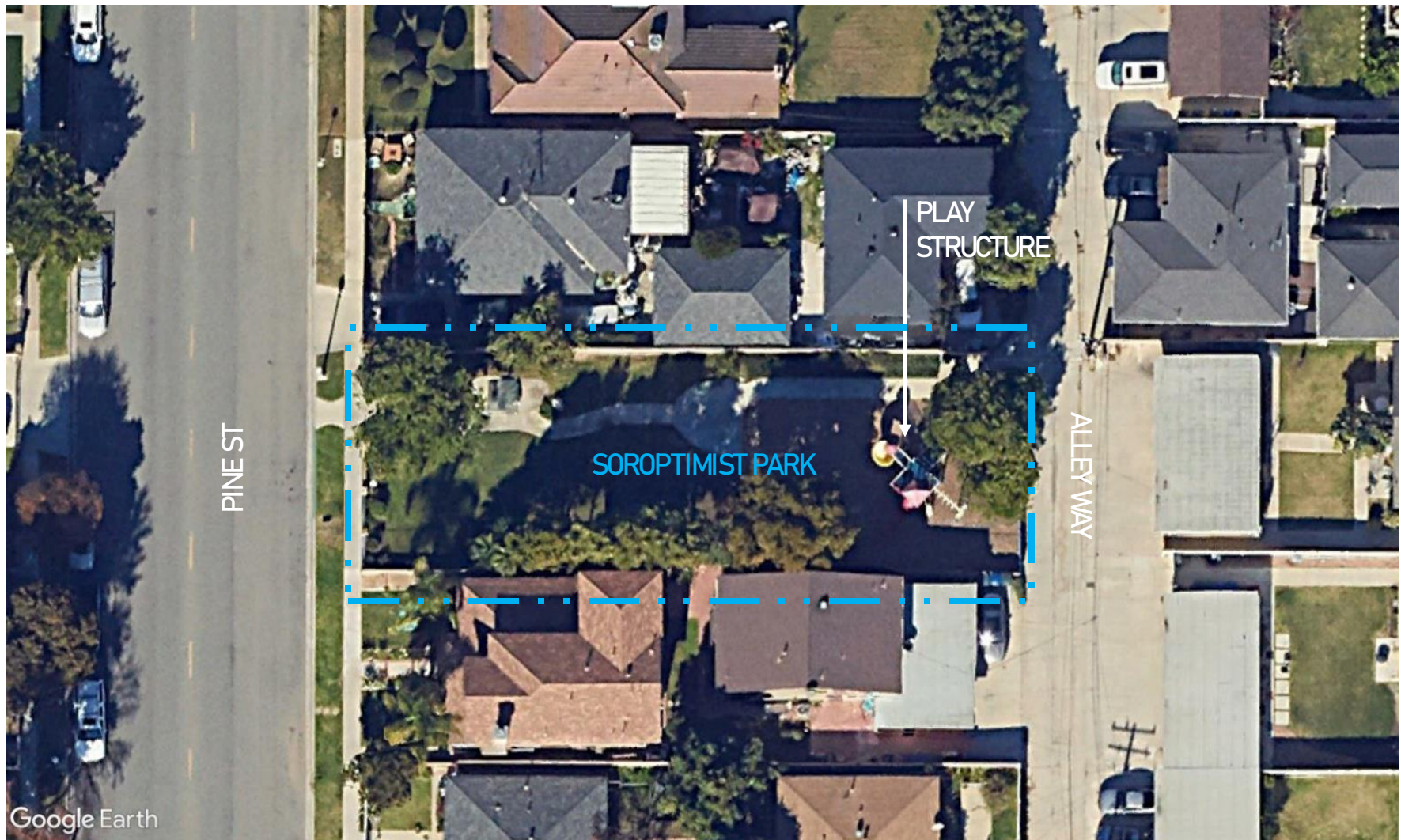

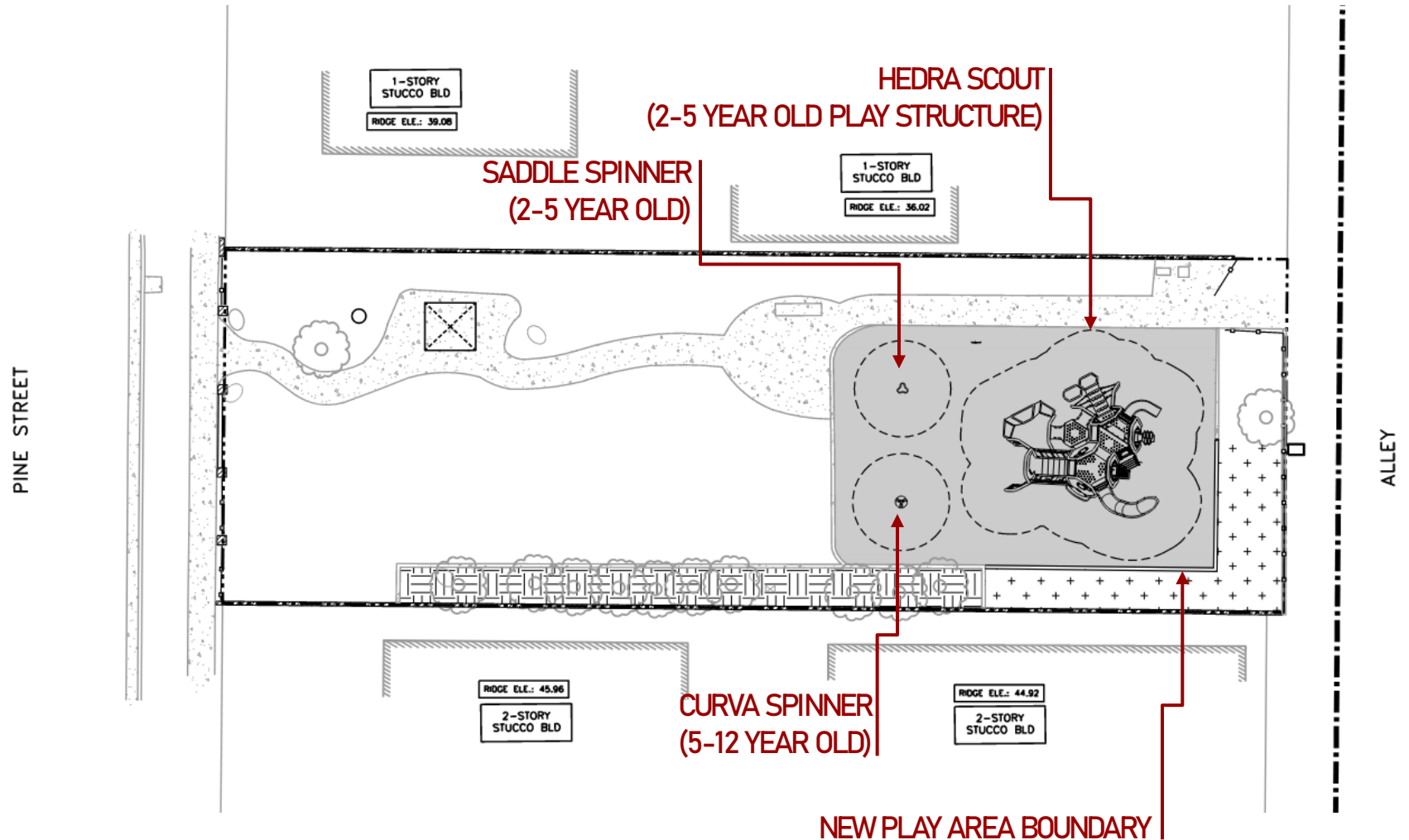
Soroptimist Park - Existing Conditions



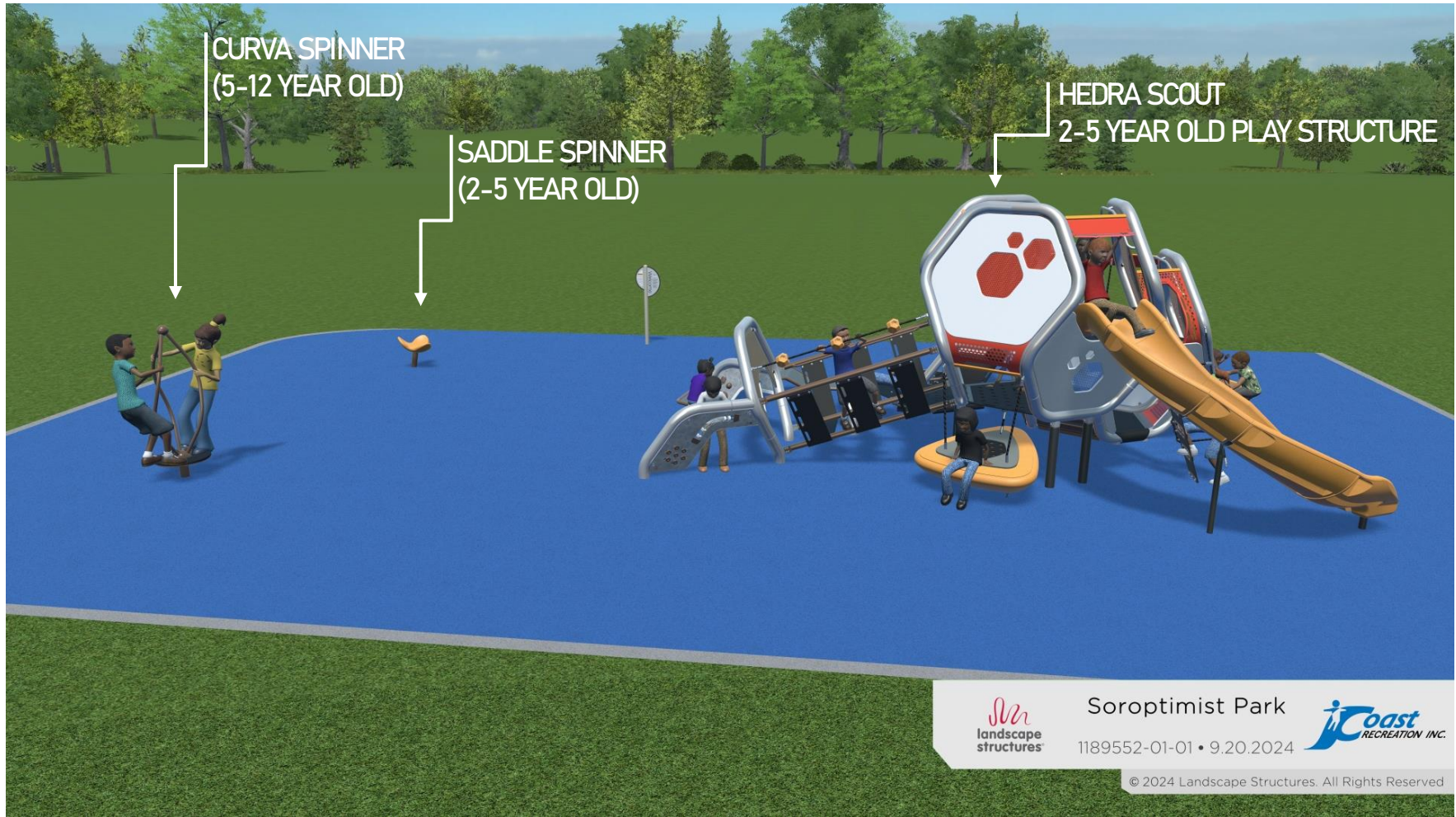

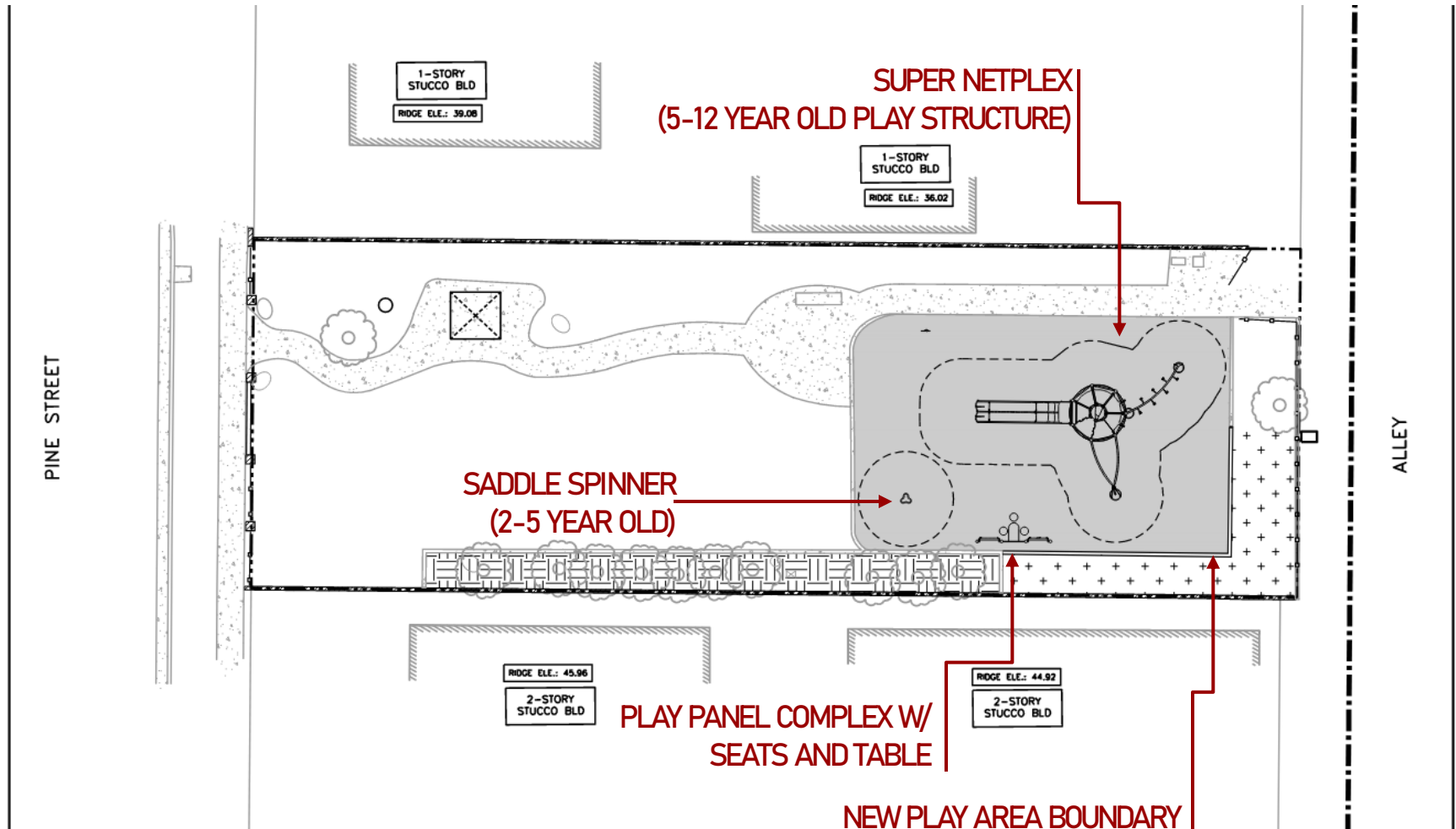

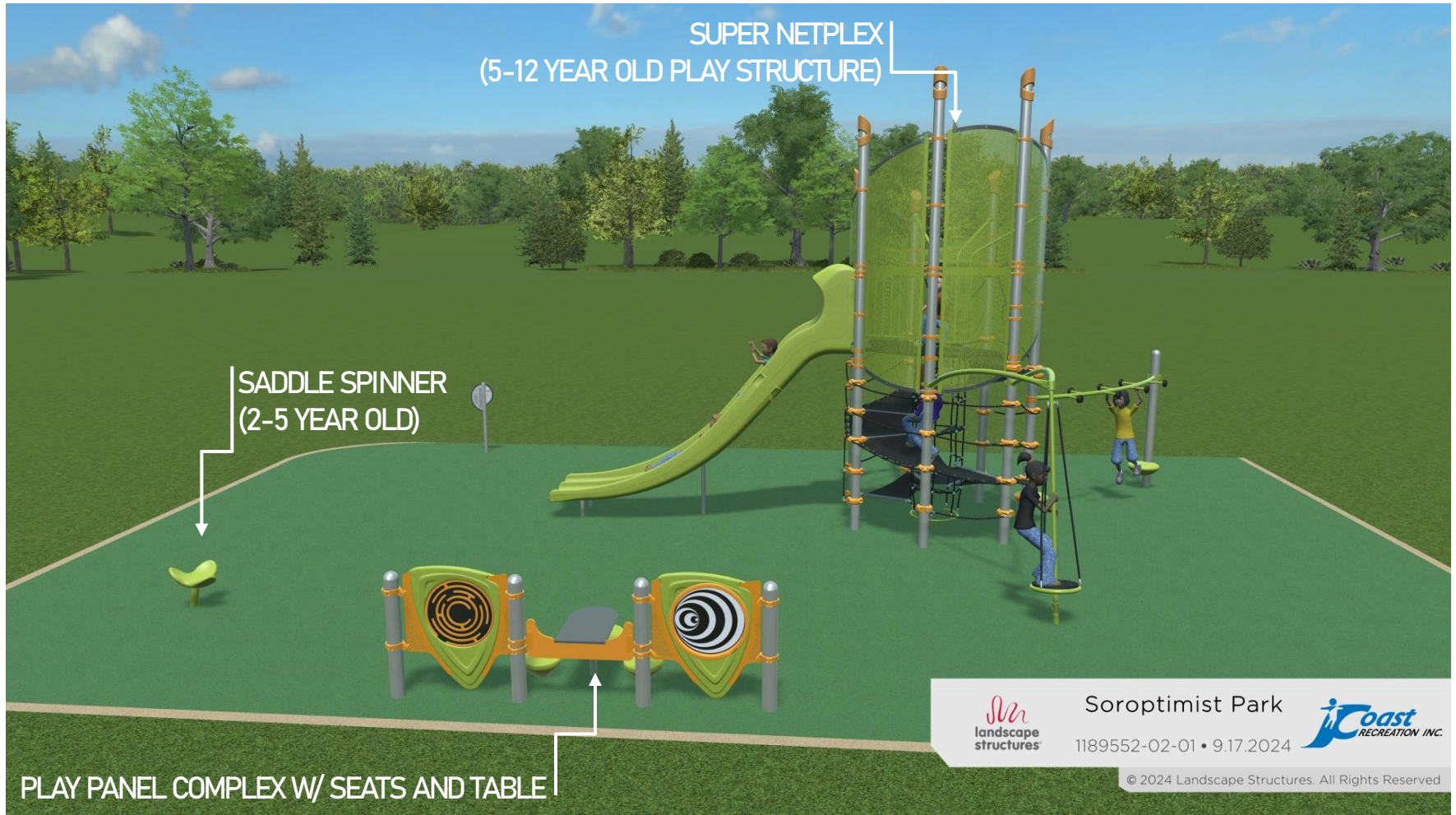

BACKGROUND

The Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department is proud to continue offering programs and events that aim to improve the community's quality of life. This report details upcoming winter programs and events.

DISCUSSION

Programs

Winter Day Camp

Winter Day camp is scheduled for Monday, December 23, to Friday, January 3. There will be no camp on 12/24, 12/25, and 1/1. Regular hours of 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. and extended hours of 7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. are available. Campers can create crafts, participate in indoor and outdoor organized activities, and more catered to the fun theme of the holidays! In addition, specialty class add-ons are available and optional for an elevated camp experience. For an additional \$15, campers can enjoy a different fun holiday activity each day from 2:00 – 3:00. Morning and afternoon snacks are provided. Registration for Winter Day Camp is currently open and can be completed at losalrecreation.myrec.com. Scholarships are available for eligible Los Alamitos residents.

Lil' Oak Preschool Program

The Winter Preschool Program offers two sessions (the first 8 weeks, the second 6 weeks). The Monday, Wednesday, and Friday class has 9 participants enrolled, and the Tuesday and Thursday class has 16 participants enrolled. Participants enjoy a fun-filled session of

educational and social development through art, crafts, games, and activities.

Contract Classes

Youth Classes - A Shotokan class is offered every Tuesday from 4:30 to 5:15 p.m. This class teaches traditional karate and self-defense to the youth. This weekly class is ideal for fostering confidence, discipline, and fitness among youth. We're excited to grow our youth programs and welcome new students of all skill levels to join.

Adult Classes - We're excited to introduce new fitness opportunities designed for our older adult community. Yoga and hula fitness classes will be available in the winter. These classes are tailored to enhance flexibility, balance, and relaxation.

Youth Sports

Co-ed Youth Basketball League

We are so excited to have the City of Los Alamitos Jr. Clippers Youth Basketball League back for the 2025 Winter Season. The league starts January 6 and goes through March 29, with practices once a week and games on Saturdays. The league is offered to grades K-8th grade with four different divisions available. Practices will be held either at the Oak Middle School Gym or local school sites. This is a great beginner to intermediate-level league as participants will be introduced to life skills, the fundamentals of basketball, and a fun gameday experience.

By joining this Jr. Clippers League, participants will have an opportunity to play in a pro-style Clippers jersey, score a free ticket voucher to select games at Intuit Dome, and much more. We can't wait to see our basketball players on the hardwood Gym floor!

Pre-School Age Sports

The Los Alamitos Recreation and Community Services Department offers two basketball programs for preschool-aged athletes: Parent & Me Basketball (2-3 years old) and Jr. Pee Wee Basketball (4-5 years old). These five-week programs are designed to introduce younger participants to the sport of basketball. Participants will learn basketball skills through clinic-style and game-based sessions. Skills that will be covered include dribbling, passing, defense, and shooting. Recreation Staff will lead classes, and an award is included in the fee. Both programs will occur on Thursdays from January 9 through February 6.

Events

Winter Wonderland

The 13th Annual MemorialCare Miller Children's and Women's Hospital Long Beach Winter Wonderland presented by UWS and Southland Credit Union event will take place Saturday, December 7, 2024 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. This year, the event will feature vendors, food trucks, ice skating, live entertainment by local youth groups, a large sledding area with four sled runs available for all ages to experience the snow, along with a snow play area, jumpers, and a train ride into "Santa's Village" at the St. Isidore Historical Plaza. All of these activities

are free to the public. The snow areas are presented by UWS and the Ice Rink is presented by Southland Credit Union. A big change this year is the moving of the snow area to the Pine Street parking lot adjacent to the ice rink. Bouncers will also be moved to Saint Isidore Historical Plaza with an expanded Santa's Village.

Costs for the majority of these events are offset by event sponsorships. Classes and programs are offset by program registration by participants enrolled.
