Subject: Oak Street - Street Improvement Project - CIP 24/25-03

SUMMARY

As part of the City's ongoing pavement management program, City staff is presenting the Traffic Commission with an update involving Street Improvements on Oak Street, CIP 24/25-03. The project will consist of grind and overlay street asphalt and repair damaged concrete for enhanced safety and travel as well as address ADA needs.

RECOMMENDATION

1. Receive and file.

BACKGROUND

The Oak Street - Street Improvement Project will include grind and overlay of asphalt pavement, and replace damaged curb, gutter and lifted sidewalk to correct drainage. American Disability Act (ADA) curb ramps will be modified to current code requirements as necessary for accessibility purposes. The project limits are Oak Street from Katella Avenue to Sausalito Street. The City Council approved project plans and specifications at the City Council Meeting on November 17, 2025, authorizing City Staff to advertise and solicit bid proposals for construction of Oak Street. The City of Los Alamitos ultimately received 11 total bids, with Hardy & Harper, Inc. coming in as the lowest responsible bid of \$364,332.00. This bid was 28.2% lower than the engineer's estimate of \$507,970.00. Staff made a recommendation for construction contingency at 15% of construction (\$54,650). City Council approved the awarding of the construction contract at the City Council Meeting on January 20, 2026.

DISCUSSION

Construction related work on the project proposes to grind and overlay asphalt as well as replace damaged curb and gutter, and lifted sidewalk to correct drainage. ADA curb ramps will be modified to current codes as necessary for accessibility. The school driveways will also be upgraded to ADA accessibility for pedestrians. The preconstruction meeting is tentatively scheduled in February with Hardy and Harper, Inc. to discuss the project timeline and scope of work.

As done in similar projects, the City and contractor will provide notices to residents within the surrounding area of the construction zone informing them of the project. The City has

communicated with Oak Middle School about the project and will consider scheduling work around heavy school traffic in order to avoid impacts on students and parents during the morning drop-offs and after-school pick-ups. The City will also consider avoiding disturbance on school bus routes. Lastly, the Police Department will be informed of the project schedule to lessen the impact on the entrance to the PD gate off Oak Street. Emergency services will not be impacted during the project.

The tentative construction schedule is as follows:

- January 20, 2026 - Award of Contract at City Council Meeting
- February 25, 2026 - Start of Construction
- April 30, 2026 - End of Construction

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this Project was included in the FY 24/25 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) adopted budget. Total Project budget is \$651,627 with funding from Gas Tax (\$341,217) and SB-1 funds (\$310,410). Funding was carried over to FY 25/26.

The following is a breakdown of the estimated Project costs:
